

## American Red Cross

Every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood. That's why Bethel is on a mission to help save lives by hosting a blood drive on Monday, July 15, from 1:00 – 6:00 to at our Fellowship Hall. We are about 25% of the way to meeting our goal of 29 donors. Let's Rally!

The community is invited to take part in this special event and donate blood for hospital patients in our neighborhoods and across the nation. The need for blood is constant, but only 3 percent of the U.S. population donates. By rolling up a sleeve, donors can play a critical role in the treatment of accident and burn victims, heart surgery and organ transplant patients, and those receiving treatment for leukemia, cancer or sickle cell disease.

To make an appointment or to learn more, download the American Red Cross Blood Donor App, visit RedCrossBlood.org or call 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767). Completion of a RapidPass® online health history questionnaire found at <u>RedCrossBlood.org/rapidpass</u> is encouraged to help speed up the donation process. A blood donor card or driver's license or two other forms of identification are required at check-in. Individuals who are 17 years of age in most states (16 with parental consent where allowed by state law), weigh at least 110 pounds and are in generally good health may be eligible to donate blood. High school students and other donors 18 years of age and younger also have to meet certain height and weight requirements.

Even if you are not able to donate, please tell your friends and neighbors about this opportunity to make a difference!

Summer Appeal 2024

John and his high school aged autistic daughter Jenny (not their real names) moved to Great Falls for a new start not realizing how hard it would be to secure affordable housing. After spending his meager savings on a hotel stay, John shared his panic with one of the Great Falls Public School representatives who brought John to Family Promise. The timing couldn't have been better as Promise Place Shelter had an opening, and John and Jenny were accepted into the Shelter. Because of Jenny's condition, it has been difficult for John to work full time so staying at Promise Place Shelter has given them a few months to plan their future. After just three months they are thriving and continuing to work through their Stability Plan which includes applying for Medicare, Section 8 Housing Assistance, food stamps, disability assistance, and saving for permanent housing.

The challenges that families face are even more acute during the summer months because children do not have the support of the school system. With rents skyrocketing due to low housing supply, families are doubling up, are constantly moving, or are seeking shelter. For the families staying at Promise Place Shelter who have secured permanent housing, the funds for their housing application, damage deposit, first month's rent, and utilities start up are high and must be paid before they can move in.

Currently the average monthly rent is approximately \$1,300 per month and most rentals require two months' rent and utilities paid up front as a deposit. That is nearly \$3,000! Our goal is to raise \$9,000 to be able to move three families from Promise Place Shelter into homes of their own in 2024. Every dollar donated helps families achieve stable housing, which in turn inspires both the parents and the children to remain committed to a brighter future. Can you help in our mission to end childhood homelessness, one family at a time?

# **GOSPEL MESSAGE**

## Sent Out

In today's gospel reading, Jesus sends the disciples out on their own (in pairs, but without him) to spread his message, and he gives them a packing list: no food, no bag, no money, no extra clothes—only the love and power of Christ, and the good will of the people they



would encounter to support them. The disciples must have felt woefully unprepared. And yet Jesus sent them anyway.

As Christians, we may feel unprepared for our journeys. We know that the Lord has sent us out into a broken world to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ, but . . . *How do we do that? What do we say? What if people don't want to hear the message? Isn't it impolite to discuss religion?* Surely the disciples shared those concerns. But they went anyway, trusting Jesus. And in trusting Jesus, they found that his message of repentance and salvation was well received. "They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them."

Perhaps this story can serve as inspiration in our own vocations. Although we may not know how to tell others about the love we've found in Jesus, we know that Jesus is supporting us in our meager efforts. We may fear rejection, but Jesus tells us to shake the dust from our feet and carry on. If we worry that we won't get it right, we can remember that the word of God does not return empty. In your baptism, Jesus has called you into his family. In holy communion, he nourishes you for the journey. Throughout your life, he gives you a story to tell others, and the power to share his good news. Take courage, Christian, and go forth in his name. He's got your back!

Tenisha is going on a walking trip or hike. What should she bring? Circle only a few items to keep her load light!




#### Serve the Lord


