May is Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women Awareness Month. While the problem of any missing or murdered person is tragic, the fact remains Indigenous women are two and a half times more likely than others to experience violent crimes. Homicide is the #3 leading cause of death for Indigenous women 10-24 years old, and the #5 leading cause of death for Indigenous women 25-34. There are 52 missing persons in Montana, half of whom have gone missing in the past year. The ELCA is committed to addressing MMIW, through education, advocacy and support. GOSPEL MESSAGE

The Unconditional Love of Disciple-Friends

Friend requests are a common feature of Facebook and similar digital platforms. When it comes to social media, "friends" are just a click away. But there is no automatic guarantee of accountability, warmth, relationship, or true belonging in a virtual community. In stark con-



trast, Jesus invites the disciples to become part of a community where selfless, sacrificial, unconditional *agape* love is the core criterion. The kingdom, or "kin-dom," of God is present wherever God's people are affirmed as children of God and siblings in Christ. But Jesus gives his disciples an additional identity: that of "friends."

In the new status Jesus confers on his disciples, the single most important criterion is love, including the readiness to lay down one's life for another. Jesus has just taught this lesson by example when he washed the feet of his disciples, including Judas Iscariot. The new commandment to love one another as Jesus loved us summarizes the whole of the gospel mandate. It is not an easy commandment by any human standards, but it is possible because Jesus himself showed us the way and forgives us when we fall short. The status of "disciple-friends" is not a request for the church, but a faith mandate.

How can we live as disciple-friends of Jesus in this world? When we believe, trust, obey, and follow the word, and the new commandment Jesus gave his disciples, a real new community is born. When we learn to embrace the other—those who are marginalized and "othered"—we partner with God in enabling the image of God to blossom to its fullest.


